Reading River of the County & State of said of the one
part & George W. River of the same place Witnesseth
that the said Reading River hath this day Made and
delivered to the said George W. River his certain promissory
note Subscribed with his hands and bearing even date
with these presents whereby the said Reading River hath
promised to pay the said George W. River or to him two
hundred & fifteen dollars 85 cts on or before day after
the date for value received now for and in consideration
of the sum of five dollars the said George W. River to the
said Reading River in hand paid the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged as for the better securing the
payment of the aforesaid promissory note the said Reading
River hath granted bargained & sold & doth by these
presents grant bargain & sell unto the said George W.
River his heirs & assigns the following property viz

One Churnet Sorrel Mare one bay horse then put
white with a blaze in his forehead one Sorrel horse
Colt one Reddish dun coloured Cow one parling
white dun cat one Cow white & Red spots one parling
mostly Red with some white under head of Stock hogs
four feather beds & furniture To have & to hold the
said bargained property to said George W. River his heirs &
assigns to his & their own proper use benefit & behoof
of the said Reading River himself his heirs
executors & administrators the said bargained property unto
George W. River will warrant & for ever defend against
the claim of himself & his heirs & against the claim
of all other persons whatum provided nevertheless
that if the said Reading River his heirs executors & adminis-
trators shall & do will & truly pay or cause to be paid
unto George W. River his heirs and assigns the for sum
tota sum of two hundred & fifteen dollars 85 cts
on the day and time mentioned & appointed for the
payment thereof in the said promissory note with lawful
interest for the same according to the tenor of said
note then & from thence forth as well this present
indenture & the right to the property thereby conveyed
as the said promissory note shall cease & become & be void
to all intents & purposes in testimony whereof the said

I know all men by their parents & that I Alexander McWilliams of the County and State of said Georgia for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars cash in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged as well as for the better securing the payment of a certain promissory note which the said Alexander McWilliams hath his day made & delivered to Thomas M. Darnall of the same place bearing even date with these presents and due one day after date whereby the said Alexander McWilliams promises to pay the said Thomas M. Darnall or bearer six ten dollars and eighteen cents for value received have bargained and sold to the said Tho. M. Darnall the following property to wit a certain small mare about seven years old four feet 8 or 10 inches high to have and to hold the of said bargain property to him the said Tho. M. Darnall his heirs and assigns forever and the said Alex. McWilliams for myself my heirs executors and administrators the said bargaining property unto the said Thomas M. Darnall his heirs and assigns against me my executors and administrators and against all and every other person or persons whom I shall and will warrant and defend by these presents. Provided nevertheless

that if the said Alex. McWilliams his heirs executors & administrators shall and do will and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Tho. M. Darnall his heirs & assigns the aforementioned sum of six ten dollars & eighteen cents on the day mentioned and appointed for the payment thereof in said promissory note mentioned with lawful interest for the same according to the tenor of said note then and from thenceforth as well this Bill of Sale and the right to the property thereby conveyed as the said promissory note shall cease determine and be void to all intents and purposes. In testimony whereof the said Alex. McWilliams hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this seven and tenth day of January 1844.
