 15th District originally Henry now F. Hall County also one
 horse wagon brown bay horse & bridle & harness
 & furniture

I give to my daughter Martha J. Simmons one step
 girl Cleo about twenty four years of age one black man &
 certain bridle & harness & furniture I give to my daughter
 Martha J. Simmons one half of lot number 35 except a small
 tract to Ezra Coffey it being originally Henry now F. Hall County
 and the south half of said lot also one step girl named
 Sarah about two years old also a small man separate also a
 red wagon painted blue also one bridle & harness
 and furniture it is to be in the dispensation of my
 that I should be called off without making a will
 give to my three named children all the remainder of
 my property to them & their heirs & assigns & that
 this or instrument not to be lost for the want of
 or any thing written therein contained to be taken by
 them in full & meaning as written my hand and seal
 this 15th day of June 1844 signed sealed &

 This Indenture made this fourteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three between Ministers & Paces by his attorney Guy W. Pace, Charles B. Pace & Guy W. Pace for himself of the one part and William Clarke of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to them in hand paid before the sealing and delivery thereof the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged both bargained sold & conveyed unto the said William Clarke a certain tract or parcel of land in the County and in the fifteenth District of Georgia formerly being but now DeKalb County & distinguished by the parts of Lots 17, 11, 12 & 58 beginning at a stake & on the S. bank of S. River near the back ford running up the E. side of said river to Johnsons line thence to a place known as the pine log or fish trap thence S. to Picias line thence S. & E. to the S. W. corner of a 7-58 thence E. 23 chrs 25 links to a stake & thence N. to the beginning containing two hundred and seven or less together with all and singular the rights, liberties and appurtenances therunto belonging to him the said William Clarke his heirs and assigns forever to have and to hold in full and sole right and the said Guy W. Pace himself and as attorney advised and the said Charles B. Pace both hereto their hands & seals the date above written by & sealed and subscribed in presence of
