the year Eighteen hundred and thirty eight a certain
order made by the name of Lewis was revised on by
order of a Jury of freeholders from a justice court
in to wit the five hundred & thirty sixth District Georgia
constituted of the State of Georgia and County of DeKalb
at the instance John S. Mitchell (vs) Billings B. Bird
wherein said leg was made by a constable of said district
& returned to me And the said of said negro being
publicly advertised in terms of the Law in such
easy manner & provided was on the fourth day of
December in said year exposed to public sale to the
highest bidder before the Court House door within
the legal hours of sale And George S. Black
being the highest bidder in having bid the sum
of one thousand & six dollars & fifty cents Now
for in consideration of said sum of money I
John M. Fowler Sheriff of said County of DeKalb
do hereby grant bargain sell & deliver said negro by
virtue to said George S. Black and do by these presents
warrant the said negro to the said Black his heirs
& assigns so far as the office of Sheriff authorizes
me to do this January 23. 1839 Signed Sealed &

Lewis in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and forty three between William C. Longshore
and Jacob Whipp both of the State and County
of said DeKalb that the said William C. Longshore
for and in the consideration of the sum of two
hundred and two dollars to him in hand paid at
and before the signing sealing and delivering these
presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
that he hath granted bargain and sold unto the said
Jacob Whipp his heirs and assigns to a certain
parcel of land situate lying and being in the sixteenth
District of originally known but now DeKalb County of
the said State known & distinguished in the plans of
said district by N. (168) one hundred and fifty eight (153)
and hundred and fifty three a part of each lot as
follows beginning at the west original pier & of the
lot of number one hundred and fifty eight running east
to the corner corner & being a maplotter thence north to a
line corner & on the original line thence to the original
lot of number one hundred and fifty three along the original line to the pier

begin & being the first corner & described being on him or
some more or less of said lot & description of the part
of Number one hundred and fifty then beginning
at the east corner of said lot running North to a
certain branch called Tammes Spring branch then down
said branch to John Sanders corner it being on which
said & thence running east with the John Sanders line to the
original line of Number one hundred and fifty right
thence North to the beginning corner being that area
more or less to have and to hold the said parcel
of land unto him the said Jacob Chepp his
heirs and assigns together with the all and singular
the rights & members & appurtenances thereof to the
same in any manner belonging to him & thence over
proper use benefit and behoof forever in fee simple
and the said William C Longshore for himself his heirs
executors and administrators the said bargain & promise
unto the said Jacob Chepp his heirs and assigns
will warrant and firm defend the right & title
thereof against themselves and against the claims
of all other persons whatever In Witness whereof
the said William C Longshore hereunto set his hand
& seal the day & date first above written signed sealed
