I, Elizabeth Kenn being of advanced age
though thank God of sound & disposing
mind & memory, do make this my last Will & testament
disposing of such property as it has pleased a kind
Providence to bless me with in manner & form following, that
as to say

Item 1st My Will & desire is that my body be buried in a decent
& christian like manner suitable to my circumstances & condition
in life

Item 2nd My Will and desire is that all of my just debts
be paid by my Executor herein after mentioned without delay.

Item 3rd I give devise & bequeath to my son John H. Kenn my
negro woman Sylvia about 32 years of age & her 6 children
to wit, Lumbo about 12 years of age Bill about 10 years of age
Peter about 8 years of age Frank a girl about 7 years of age
and about 3 years of age & Green about 2 months old
and her future increase.

Item 4th I give & bequeath to my son John H. Kenn
the one half of Lot of Land No 138 in the 7th district
of Dooly County and adjoining lands belonging to
Wm. Bryant & the land on which I now live.

Item 5th I give & bequeath to my son Zachariah S. Kenn
the other half of the Lot of Land devised to my son
John H. Kenn

Item 6th It is my Will & desire that the following named
negro slaves to wit Sophia a woman about 22 years of
age & her 2 children Daniel about 5 years of age & George
about 3 years of age Fanny a girl about 16 years of
age & Lemmy about 14 years of age & their future increase
be equally divided between my sons John H. Kenn,
Zachariah S. Kenn my Grand son George Lewisson
& my son Eli Kenn's children (that is my son Eli Kenn's
children I share between them) share & share alike

Item 7th I give & bequeath to my Grand Daughter
Elizabeth Kenn & Daughter of my son Eli Kenn

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Item 1st It is my Will & desire that all the residue of my house hold & Kitchen furniture of every kind & description be Equally divided among my now living children
Item 2nd It is my Will & desire that the Legacies herein bequeathed to my son Eli Penns children & my Grand son George Swearingen be held in in Trust by my son John H. Penn for their use & benefit.

Item 3rd My Will & desire is that in the Event of my son John H. Penns dying without issue that one half of the Legacies herein bequeathed return back to the balance of my legal heirs.

Item 4th I hereby nominate constitute & appoint my son John H. Penn sole Executor to this my Last Will and Testament.

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May Term 1866

May in the year 1866 for the purpose of proving the
last will & Testament of Elizabeth Tenn. Rev of the
witnesses to said will viz David J. Botkewell & Georg W.
McDowell and the will having been before that time brought
before me for probate by the executor John H. Tenn who has
filed a petition for the probate of the same & they the said
witnesses depose of the same that they saw said Elizabeth Tenn
sign & publish the same as her last will on the day and year
before mentioned that D. J. Botkewell witnessed the same at
her request in her presence and in the presence of each other that
the same was voluntarily executed by her while she was of
sound mind & disposing mind & memory
