State of Georgia In the name of God Amen.

Dooly County 3<sup>d</sup> Henry Collins of said State and County being  
of advanced age, and knowing that I must shortly  
depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects my  
family and myself that I shall make a disposition of the property  
with which a kind Providence has blessed me so therefore make  
this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others  
hereunto made by me,

1<sup>st</sup> Item, I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent  
and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and  
condition in life, My soul I trust shall return to rest with  
God who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through the merits  
and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ  
whose Religion I have professed and as I humbly trust enjoyed  
for thirty five years.

2<sup>d</sup> Item, I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid  
without delay by my Executor hereafter appointed as I am un-  
willing my Creditors should be delayed in their rights especially  
as there is no necessity for delay.

3<sup>rd</sup> Item, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucinda  
whom I have lived in the strictest quiet for thirty two years  
all my estate both real and personal, My Beloved son William  
J. Collins to live on my Plantation and support his Mother  
for ten years that being left to her choice, but if she chooses  
all my Estate to be appraised and sold and an equal  
division made with all my children with in that time,

4<sup>th</sup> Item, I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved  
wife Lucinda Executing and my beloved son William J. Collins  
Conductor of this my last Will and Testament,
