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The last Will and Testament of Isaac Younbanks

Dooly County Will Bk 1847-1861

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State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen
Dooly County } I Isaac Younbanks of said State and County
being of advanced age and knowing that I must
shortly this Life deem it right and proper both as respects my family
and myself that I should make a disposition of the property
within which a kind providence has blessed me, do therefore
make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in
a decent and christian like manner suitable to my Circum-
stances and constitution in Life my Soul I trust shall return
to rest with God who gave it as I have always striven to live
a life of proberty, Integrity and Virtue

Item 2^d I desire and direct that all my Just debts be
paid without delay by my Executors herein after appointed
as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their
rights especially as there is no necessity for delay.

Item 3^d I give bequeath and devise unto my beloved
daughter Tempy Wigdon Lot of Land number One hun-
dred and sixty nine in the 7th district of (Dooly County
containing Two hundred Two and a half (2 1/2) acres more
or less also six acres of Land off of the South West corner
of Lot of Land number One hundred and Seventy wherein
my house now stands said property to be held by Pleasant
W. Key of the County of Worth in said State as Trustee
for my daughter Tempy Wigdon and not to be subject
to the debts of her husband Amos D. Wigdon or to be sold
or otherwise conveyed away or disposed of by her said hus-
band Amos D. Wigdon without her consent first obtained
in writing

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
Tempy Wigdon all my negro property consisting of the
following negroes To wit Abby a woman who I desire
to be kindly treated and cared for as she is of advanced

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age, beaver a man about forty years of age, Anaka a woman, about twenty eight years of age and Georgian about seven years old and it is my Will and desire that Pleasant W Key should become my daughter Sempley Wigdon's trustee in the management and control of said negroes and that my daughter should have the benefit of said negroes slaves and I further Will and desire that said negroes shall not be subject to be sold for the debts of her said husband Amos D Wigdon but to be held under the trusteeship aforesaid said negroes not to be sold by her said husband Amos D Wigdon or any other person whatsoever unless by her my daughter Sempley Wigdon's special consent in writing

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Sempley Wigdon (my sole and only heir) three head of horned all my stock of hogs and fattening hogs one yoke of oxen and all my stock cattle all my household and kitchen furniture said property I desire may be subject to the same Trusteeship herein before mentioned not subject to any debts or contracts of the said Amos D Wigdon but to be held in trust by the said Pleasant W Key for my daughter Sempley Wigdon and not to be sold or otherwise disposed of without her consent obtained in writing

Item 6th The residue whatever and wherever it may be together with all the property herein before mentioned both real and personal I will and bequeath to my beloved and affectionate daughter Sempley Wigdon said property to be held by the said Pleasant W Key in trust for my daughter Sempley Wigdon not subject as aforesaid to be sold or conveyed away for the debts of her present husband or any future husband but to be my daughter's Sempley Wigdon to dispose of as she may deem best at her death

Item 7th I hereby appoint and constitute my worthy friend Pleasant W Key Executor of this my last Will and Testament January 8th 1856
