In the name of God Amen
I John Touluck being of adult
age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this
World deem it proper both as respects myself and family to
make a distribution of the property with which a kind
Providence hath blessed me I therefore make this
my last Will and Testament.

Item First I desire and direct that my body be
buried in a decent manner suitable to my condition.

Item Second I desire and direct that all my Just debts
be paid without delay by my Executor herein after
named

Item Third I give and devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth
Three hundred dollars good and Lawfull money I
also give my wife One bed and furniture and one
large Chest all of which I bequeath without
Reservation or Limitation

Item Fourth I desire and direct that all the rest of
my property both Real and personal wherever and
whatsoever it may be, be sold and the proceeds thereof
be equally divided between all my Children.

Item Fifth I constitute and appoint my beloved
son Norvel R Touluck Executor to this my last
Will and Testament this August 29th 1855

Before me Alexander Meriwether Ordinary of said County personally came in open Court Norvell R. Douluach Executor of the last Will & Testament of John Douluach late of said County deceased and two of the witnesses to said Will to wit John I. Moreland and Middleton Patrick which witnesses being duly sworn depone and say that they saw John Douluach the Testator sign seal declare and publish the Instrument now presented as his last Will and Testament freely voluntarily and of his own accord and without any compulsion or influence whatever that at the time of the signing of the said Will said Testator was of sound and disposing mind and Memory that deponents signed said Will as witnesses in the presence of the Testator and at his special Instance and request and in the presence of each other

It appearing to the Court that the last Will and Testament of John Douluach deceased having been produced in open Court by Norvell R. Douluach the Executor therein named and proven on the Testimony of John I. Moreland and Middleton Patrick two of the subscribing Witnesses to said Will It is therefore Ordered that the same be received and admitted to Record and that Letters Testamentary do issue to the said Norvell R. Douluach in terms of the Statute in such cases made and provided
