through the blood and Saviour Jesus Christ whom
adoring I have professed and as I humbly have
engaged for twenty Years, I earnestly desire
and direct that all my Just Debt be paid forth-
with by my Executor hereinafter named as I am
unwilling my Creditors should be delayed of their
right especially as there is no necessity for delay
them therein I give and direct to my beloved wife
Mary with Whom I have served in the strictest
and love for thirty one Year, lot of land numbered
one hundred and five in the tenth district of
County of Loudoun containing two hundred two and three
acres during her Natural lifetime and at her death
said lot of land to go to my Son David A. Callaghan
I also give and bequeath my Wife the Farming
implements on and belonging to said plantation
very discompleting Wharves and my two horses with
Feed and Carriage my Stock of Hay all my
tools and Kitchen furniture Except that part
I shall hereafter mention; I also give to my
Wife my Negro woman Hannah during her
life and I give to the said

to My daughter Mary G. My Negro Child Mary
and her sister Mabel, Item Eighth the rest of My prop-
erty real and personal whatever it may be. Want it
Sold by My Executors, Item Ninth I Give to
my sister in law, Sarah Conrad twenty acres of land
situated in part of lot number One hundred and
one on the South line during her life time.
Item Tenth I Constitute and appoint My
Friends Philo Dixon and Whannou Executors to the
last Will and Testament this October 25th 1841
