

Will of Joseph Locky

Georgia } In the name of God Amen I Joseph Locky
Dorcy County } am about to leave my native home as a
Volunteer to defend the rights and interest
of my country deem it proper to make a disposition
of my property & therefore make this my last will and
Testament

Item 1st I desire and direct that all my just debts shall be
paid without delay

Item 2nd I give and devise to my niece Endora J. Tappett
daughter of John H. Tappett and my sister now dead
Martha Jane Tappett the sum of one dollar.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my brother James G. Locky
the sum of one dollar.

Item 4th The rest of my property both real & personal
Wherever and whosoever it may be I desire and direct to
be divided equally into four parts I will and bequeath
unto my mother Athaliah Locky one portion to her
and her heirs for ever. I will and bequeath unto my
brother William B. W. Locky one portion to him and
his heirs forever. I will and bequeath unto my sister
Elizabeth H. Haskbourn one portion to her and her heirs
forever. I will and bequeath unto my sister Mary
W. Gammage one portion to her and her children
forever and if the said Mary W. Gammage dies with
out leaving any children it is my will that her said
portion of property be given to the following named
persons to wit my mother Athaliah Locky my Brother
William B. W. Locky my sister Elizabeth H. Hask-
bourn and their heirs forever.

Item 5th I hereby appoint my brother in law
Levallen Haskbourn trustee of the property of
my estate that shall fall to my sister Mary W. Gammage
and her children

Item 6th I appoint Levallen Haskbourn Executor
to this my last will and testament This I done
19th 1861.
