

Will of Shemuel A. Lasseter
 State of Georgia } Dooly County Will Bk 1847-1901
 Dooly County } and County Knowing that sooner or
 later that death must come and take
 me from this world and feeling it to be my duty to
 arrange and direct my little property in such manner that
 it may be of some benefit to my family, do hereby make
 ordain and publish this as my last will and Testament
 hereby revoking all others.

Item 1st My body I leave at the disposal of my family
 to dispose of as they see proper. My soul I commit
 to God who gave it, and whom I have tried in a
 feeble way for many years to serve.

Item 2nd My property of every description whether
 land negroes, stock of any description money notes
 or other evidences of debt I give and bequeath to my
 wife Jane A. Lasseter, knowing that by doing this
 it will benefit her and the children more than to
 divide it. She is to have full and entire control
 of all the property use and have the same, sell any part
 thereof either land negroes or other property at private
 sale and make deeds thereof, without any order of Court
 or buy any description of property in the same manner
 as above described. But in case my said wife should
 marry again, then I desire that an Administration
 should be had, on my said estate, and equally divided
 between her and all my children living at that
 time, or if she does not marry again at her death
 I wish an Administration had and an equal division
 of what of the estate then remaining among all my children
 then living and in order to carry out this Will I hereby
 nominate and appoint my said wife Jane A. Lasseter Execu-
 trix to execute the same.
