

Will of William F. Bealle

Dooly County Will Bk 1847-1904
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State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen.

Dooly County } I William F. Bealle being of sound and disposing mind and memory yet of feeble health and knowing that I must shortly die and being desirous to make a disposition of my property do make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

Item 1st I give to my Sister Antimesia E. Jones Wife of James M. Jones all the property of whatever kind or description which I own or possess except as hereinafter mentioned and appropriated after the payment of all my debts,

Item 2^d, I hereby set apart the sum of One Thousand dollars to be paid by my Executor hereinafter named for the erection of a suitable Monument or Marble Slab over each of the graves of my father, my mother and my brother John Bealle as also the sum of One Thousand dollars to be applied by my said Executor in the purchase of a small lot or tract of ground in Rose Hill Cemetery near the City of Macon in said State where I desire and direct that my body shall be buried as also for the erection of a suitable Marble Monument over my grave I also direct that my body shall be buried in a Metallic Coffin,

Item 3^d, I hereby nominate and appoint my worthy friend Abraham D. Paul my executor to this my last Will and Testament,
