

Last Will and Testament of Mary Minson

George Dougherty County, I, Mary Minson Widow of George Minson deceased, being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make this my last Will and Testament, Revoking all other wills heretofore made by me.

Item 1st

It is my will and desire that all my Household and Kitchen furniture shall be Equally divided between my five youngest children, to-wit: Jane, Elizabeth, William, Mary, & George share and share alike.

Item 2nd

It is my wish and desire, and I do hereby direct that all the balance of my estate both real and personal which I now have or may hereafter be entitled to shall be Equally divided amongst my living children. Excluding the portions of such as may now be dead. The share or portion to which my daughters may be entitled to in the said estate shall be paid to them in separate portions subject to the direction of any Husband they may have. My said daughters shall have the right to dispose of the same by Will only, to become the property of such persons as such will may direct.

The use of said property during the life of any said daughters to be for the joint use & support of themselves and their children, and in no case shall the same be sold except under a decree of Court of Equity filed at the instance of any said daughters.

Item 3rd

I desire that all my just debts be paid by my Executor out of the property disposed of in the second item of this will.

Item 4th

I do hereby appoint Norton P. Minson Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal and thereby publishing this my last Will and Testament this 15th day of June 1866.
