

Last Will & Testament of Mrs Sarah Fowhams
late of Dougherty County, Georgia

Georgia In the Range of Good Men
Dougherty County I Sarah Fowhams of said County
and State being of sound & disposing
Mind & Memory but fully impressed with the
uncertainty of life do make publish & declare
this my Last Will and Testament in manner
& form following

Item 1st

Supplementing this Will to be a final disposition
of my Estate I hereby revoke all wills before
made by me particularly the one made & executed
by me the 11th day of November 1858

Item 2^d

I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Clifton
the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200)

Item 3^d

I give and bequeath to my son John L. B. Scarborough
a certain Negro man named Henry and his child
Emma, who remain in trust for my grand son
John S. Clifton son of my said daughter Mary Clifton
with power to the said John L. B. to hire out the
said Negro until the said John S. Clifton arrives
at the age of twenty one years & to appropriate
the proceeds of said hire to my grand son
benefit as said Trustee may think proper and
when the said John L. B. arrives at said age the
said John L. B. is further directed to turn over
said Negro to him absolutely & in fee simple
But in the event that the said John S. Clifton
should depart this life before attaining said age
then & in that event I wish said Negro to be
transferred in this item of my will to go to my
Grand daughter Mary Jane Clifton the wife of
the said John S.

Item 4th

I give & bequeath to my beloved son John L. B.
Scarborough the following Negroes to wit
Anthony, Peter, Julia Ann, Lommon, Hannah
and also Maria & their increase for & during
his lifetime and after his death to his children

share and share alike in fee simple

Item 6th

I give and bequeath to my beloved son James E. Scarborough a certain negro man named Jack & also the sum of one hundred dollars to be his property in fee simple

Item 7th

I also give & bequeath to my son James E. Scarborough a certain negro girl named Rose about three years old in trust for the sole & separate use of my daughter Scarborough daughter of the said James E. & Sarah Scarborough

Item 8th

I give and bequeath to my son John L. B. Scarborough the sum of one thousand dollars in trust for Robert Faircloth, John A. H. Faircloth, William Faircloth, James Faircloth, and Thomas Faircloth my grandsons and sons of my deceased daughter Elizabeth James Faircloth and Susan B. Faircloth with power to the said John L. B. to loan out said sum of money or apply the yearly proceeds to the benefit of any said grandchild or children of each to be turned over to him - and in the event that there is not sufficient money arising from the sale of my property as hereinafter provided for to pay the debts then & in that event, I will & desire that my son John L. B. Scarborough shall make up the deficiency out of his share

Item 9th

I wish my Executor hereinafter appointed to sell all of the balance of my property both real & personal and after the payment of my just debts & the specific legacies hereinafter given the proceeds to be divided equally between my son John L. B. Scarborough and James E. Scarborough share and share alike

Item 10th

I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son John L. B. Scarborough & my nephew James P. Brinson Executors of this my last Will & Testament

In Witness whereof I have signed this my last Will & Testament at this my residence
