I desire and will that after my death

I will and desire that my Executor
hereinafter named pay all my just
debts out of my effects.

I will and bequeath to my beloved
wife, J. S. McEwen the following land
to wit: Lot of land number Six hundred
and seventy seven (677) Seven hundred and
eight (608) and seven hundred and nine
(609), in the eighteenth district and Six
and section of Originally Cherokee no.
Douglas County, County containing One
hundred and twenty (120) acres more
or less, the same embracing the
house and improvements where I
now reside, for and during her
natural life, and after her death the
remainder to be equally divided but
under the legacies hereinafter named
and I also will and desire that my
said Executor pay to her my said
wife the sum of three hundred do
ars out of my effects, to be her
absolutely to use as she desires.

I will and bequeath all of the remainder
of my estate, after the above named
legacies are paid, to Louisa Phillips, J. P.
McEwen, Alexander H. S. McEwen,
Carmy C. Bullard, and W. S. McEwen. The
same to be equally divided, equally

between all of them share and share alike to be in fee simple forever. The same to be sold by my said son on such terms and in such manner as he may deem best, and the proceeds divided as above directed.

I will and desire that my son McEwen be my Executor and be appointed such with full power and authority to carry out the above provisions, even without having this will probated, if all of my legattees should consent, and it is my desire that interested in this will shall pay as it bears all expenses.

I, Alexander D. McEwen do hereby declare and publish this as my last will and Testament containing the foregoing pages signed with my hand and dated December 16th 1888, in the presence of
