

Georgia, Douglas County.

I, E. P. Bowen, of said state and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and testament.

1. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid and that my body be buried in a christian like manner.

2. I give bequath and devise to my beloved wife, Malissa A. Bowen the home place in Douglasville, Georgia, where we now reside consisting of nine acres more or less, with all the improvements situated thereon for and during her natural life to be accepted by her in lieu of dower and at her death the said property to be sold and the proceeds arising from said sale to be divided as follows, to wit:

My two daughters Mrs. Maggie Bomar and Mrs. Cora Hunter each to receive the sum of \$200.00 and after said sums are paid the remainder to be divided in four equal shares, one share to be paid to the children of my daughter Bellena Mc Gouirk; one share to be paid to my beloved daughter Maggie Bomar; one share to be paid to my beloved daughter Cora Hunter, and one share to be paid to my beloved granddaughter Annie Mary Wright, and if either of the said parties should be dead at the death of my said wife the amounts herein bequeathed to such deceased party to be paid to their children or decendents of children, and if either of said parties at the

death of my said wife should have died without issue then said remainder to be divided into three equal shares the same to be distributed as herein stated.

2. I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Malissa A. Bowen all the other property, real and personal, not heretofore disposed of of which I may die seized and possessed, absolutely in fee simple.

4. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Malissa A. Bowen executrix of this my last will and testament. She is not required to give bond as such nor have any appraisements made or make any annual returns.
