- Item I. I desire my body shall be buried in

- Item II. I direct that all my debts be paid
as soon after my death as the same
can be conveniently done.
- Item 3. Should it be necessary to sell
any part of my estate to pay my
debts, then I direct that my wife sell
such part or parts of my estate as
can be best spared and most
advantageously used to sold for the
purpose of paying my debts.
- Item 4. Should it be necessary to sell any
of my estate to pay my estate as
before referred to, I direct that my
wife sell the same at public or
private sale as she may think best
without any order from Court of
ordinary authority therefor hereby
conferred.
- Item 5. I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Catharine A. Malone all the residue
of my estate after the payment of
my debts, as herein before provided.
that is my entire estate both real
and personal lands consisting of the
North half of lot (704) Seven Hundred
and Four in the first district and
Third Section of Douglas County, and
all of lots (647) Six hundred and Forty
Seven and (139) Seven Hundred and
Thirty nine, and West half of (648) Six
Hundred and Forty eight of the 18th
District and Second Section of now
Douglas County and all other lands

that I may own at the time of my death over all personal estate as above named of every kind that I may own at my death including money, notes, accounts, houses, mules, cattle, vehicles, crops, products, and each and every species of personal estate the request herein made to my said wife is for and during her natural life, - after her death to be divided as hereafter named in this my will.

Item 6. I direct that my said wife act as Catharine A. McStone - act as executor of this my will and manage my estate during her natural life.

Item 7. After the death of my said wife I direct that all my estate be sold by my executor hereinabove named and equally divided between all my children shear and shear alike, and should any of my children be dead at the time of the death of my said wife then I direct that the children "if any" of my deceased children stand in lieu of and take in lieu of their deceased parents.

Item 8. I direct that after the death of my wife that my executor hereinabove named sell all my real estate before the court house door at Douglasville after advertising said sale for four weeks in the news paper in which the Sheriff's sale for the county of Douglas is advertised - over my personal estate to be sold on the premises after posting notices for twenty days at 5 or more public places.

Item 9. I hereby direct that all sales under this will be made without

any order from the court of ordinary power therefore hereby conferred on my said election.

Item 10. I hereby appoint and constitute my son W. L. Malone executor of this my last will and testament to take charge of and administer my said estate after the death of my said wife Catharine A. Malone.
