I Cordial T. Melborn of the County of Douglas and State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills heretofore made by me.

And first I commit my soul to God who gave it.

My worldly estate I dispose of as follows.
First - It is my will that all my just debts shall be paid.

Secondly - It is my will that my dearly beloved wife Margaret T. Melborn have my land being the North half of lot of land One hundred and twenty one (121) lying and being in the Third District of Originally Carroll now Douglas County containing one hundred and one and one quarter acres; Also two acres of land off of said lot lying and being in the North east corner of the other half of said lot of land and that she is to have sole possession and use of said land during her natural life.

Thirdly - It is my will that my dearly beloved Step son William J. Lapsater have the land described in clause second of this my will after the death of my dearly beloved wife.

Fourthly - It is my will that my dearly beloved Step daughter Martha B. Lapsater have two hundred dollars in money to be paid by my Step son William J. Lapsater as follows Fifty dollars at the end of twelve months after the death of my wife, and fifty dollars annually until he has paid her the sum of two hundred dollars in all.

In witness whereof I the said Cordial T. Melborn to this my will consisting of the foregoing one sheet of paper have put my hand and seal this eighth day of November 1873.
