a sufficiency of money or cotton to pay said
debts I desire that a sufficient amount of
my other personal property consisting of my
Cous Wagon or any other personal property
that I may posse at the time of my
death be sold and applied to the payment
of my said debts until all my just debts
are paid

Item 2 I give and bequeath to the following named persons
my lot of Land in Douglas County namely lot number
one hundred and thirtysix the same being the
lot on which I now reside I desire that said
Land be equally divided between my wife
Gelina Cochran my son Alexander Cochran
My daughter Frances Frankly Julie Barnes

Item 3 I desire that the above said persons shall
only take a life estate in the aforesaid lot
of Land and have no power or authority to
dispose of the same and that the interest
that I have heretofore bequeathed to my
wife be and remain her property until her
death and then become the property of my
said son and daughter and my step son
Lotto with the same limitations that I shall
here after make to the interest I bequeath to
them

Item 4 I desire that each of the aforesaid persons
namely Alexander Barnes Julie and Lotto
shall take only a life estate in said in
trust in said land which I have bequeathed
to them and at their deaths to revert in
and become the property of their heirs
at law then living
over

Item 8th

I desire that all the personal property remaining if any after my debts are paid be equally divided between my said wife Gilma my said son Alexander and my said daughter Frances and Julia and my said step son Scott.

Item 6th I hereby constitute and appoint my son Alexander Cochran executor of this my last will and testament.
