tainty of life and the certainty of death, deem it proper
and proper that I should make a distribution of the prop-
erty with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do
therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby
revoking and abrogating all other testaments made

Item first I desire that my body should be decently buried
suitable to my circumstances ~~and~~ and desires in
life, my soul I trust will return to God who gave
it as I hope for salvation through the grace of our
Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Maria A
Smith to have and to hold to her during the term
of her natural life all of my property, both real and
personal whatever

Item 3 I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
Sarah Ann Coase wife of Nathaniel Coase
the remainder after the death of my said wife
and after the termination of the life estate I have
given to my said wife, a part of which life estate
being the entire half of land lot number one
hundred and twenty seven (127) in 2nd dist and
4th section the same being the west half of
said lot and upon & now resides, Ten acres
of land in the north east corner of said
half lot, bounded as follows, commencing

at a point on the North and south line
at a certain Black gum tree and near the
corner of the field cleared by Matt Evans and
running due West until the distance is reached
that is said running from that point to the east
and west side of said land which east and west
line is also the district line, will make ten acres
and making the ten acres in the North east
corner of said (half) lot of land as aforesaid
to the said Sarah Ann to have to her and
her heirs after the termination the said side
estate having no mention for ever.

Item 4th No. my son William Thomas Smith I give
in remainder after the termination of the
said estate heretofore given to my wife and
after the death of my said wife that portion
of the said land lot (No 127) described as follows
commencing at the Black gum tree on the North
and South line on east side of the said (half) lot
for a corner for that portion given to my
daughter Sarah Ann Evans thence running
south the width of the said lot one hundred
and thirty nine yards thence due west across
the entire breadth of said half lot to the
North and South line on the west side of
said land thence due north along the
said original line of said lot to the
corner of said lot thence east along the
land side of said lot to where the north
and south line on the west side of Sarah
Ann Evans land intersects with said original
line thence south along the side of the
land given herinafter to said Sarah Ann
Evans to the south west corner of her said
ten acres thence due east to the Black gum
and starting point to her the said William
Thomas in remainder over after his death to
during the term of his natural life remain
over after his death to his heirs share
and share alike forever.

Item 5th All of the rest of my land after the death of my said wife and after the death of Sarah Ann my daughter shall have received her two acres in the north east corner as her inheritance bequeathed to her, and after my said son William Thomas shall have received his portion as is in item four of this my will provided together with the mule & now own it in debt and all the produce corn Hogs, oat shucks, cotton seeds, meat that may be on hand at the death of said wife and which may belong to my estate, I give to my two sons Stephen Wallace and Reuben Hamilton Smith to them and the survivor of them and his of such survivor in fee forever.

Item 6th In case either of my two sons Stephen Wallace and Reuben Hamilton should die before my said wife then the other or survivor of them shall take what I have given to them both. In case both my said sons Stephen Wallace and Reuben Hamilton should die before my said wife then I desire what I have given them shall go to and belong to my daughter Sarah Ann Eason and William Thomas my son to have to them and their heirs forever. In case my said sons Stephen Wallace and Reuben Hamilton should die before their mother my said wife and the said William Thomas and Sarah Eason should also die, Then what I gave Stephen & Reuben to belong to May Hoda and Queen Melior my daughter, and in case they too should ten be dead then to my right heirs then surviving forever.

Item 7th I desire all my just debts be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable and that all sums due me be collected to help pay them

I give to John Jones Randolph sons and Lorraine Walker a daughter each one dollar

9 I dont make this unequal distribution of my property among my wife and children because I love any one of them more, or less, than another for I love all my children equally and alike, but make my will thus because I deem it best to do so

10 After my death I desire my wife to have all my House hold and Kitchen furniture and at her death I desire my son William Thomas Neuber Hamilton Stephen Wallace and my daughter Queen Victoria each to have a bed and all the rest of it to be sold and divided among all my children equally

11 I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son Stephen Wallace Smith the Executor of this my last Will and Testament this March 27th 1883 James G Smith
