- Item 4. I give bequeth and devise to my beloved son John M Hatchett my home place consisting of the following lands to wit Lots numbers (84 + 105) and 40 acres of lot no. 78 all in the first district and fifth section of originally Carroll now Douglas County to belong to him at and after my wifes death forever in fee simple.
- Item 5. I hereby constitute and appoint my said son John M Hatchett, Executor of this my last will and testament.
