Executor hereinafter named, and
appointed

Thirdly, I desire and direct that at my
death my Executor shall without delay sell
all my real and personal property, and,
after paying all the expences and all my
just debts make an equal division of all
the money, so arising from said sale,
with and between my beloved daughters
I J Garner & C Howell & A Weddington
& F McCarty and M. O. McBreath, I
desire and direct that all my property
at my death be sold, and an equal
division made between my daughters above
named. I desire and direct that if there is
any property owned by me not specially
mentioned in this my will, that my Executor
shall sell the same and divide the money
arising from said sale equally between
my daughters above mentioned as
I desire that they and only they shall by

all and every part of my property.

Fourthly I do hereby appoint and constitute my beloved son-in-law A G Weddington Executor of this my last will and testament this August 29th 1881
