I, E.B. McWhorter, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others, by me heretofore made:

Item One.

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life.

ITEM TWO.

I direct that a suitable stone be erected at my grave within a reasonable time after my death, such a stone as is usual for persons of my station while in life.

ITEM THREE.

I, direct that all my debts be paid without any unnecessary delay.

ITEM FOUR.

I give and bequeath and devise to my wife, Martha McWhorter, for and during her life and in case she should marry after my death, during her widowhood, all my property, personal, real and choses in action, and all my property of whatever kind and character.

ITEM FIVE.

Upon the death of my said wife, or upon her marriage should she marry after my death, I give, bequeath and devise that all my property real, personal and choses in action and money be divided equally among my children then living, and should any of my children die hereafter and leave any child or children living at date of death or marriage of my said wife as aforesaid, or any descendants of any child or children. I direct that such share of my said deceased child be given and divided equally among such child or descendant of such deceased child or children.

ITEM SIX.

I hereby appoint my son, B.H. McWhorter, executor of this my last will and testament, and should he die before death or marriage as aforesaid of my said wife, then I direct that my son, W.A. McWhorter, act as executor of this my last will and testament. I further direct that neither of my said executors be required to give bonds such, and that they be not required to make returns to the Ordinary of their acts, and that after probate of this my last will and testament, the same be admitted to record.

any further accounting to the Ordinary or to any other court what-
soever, of his acts as executor.

ITEM SEVEN.

I direct that my executor be empowered, and he is hereby em-
powered with authority to sell any or all of my property of what
-soever kind and character at private sale, without order or
authority from Ordinary or any ^{any} ~~part~~ ^{other} court and to make deeds and
to execute titles thereto without any order or authority from
Ordinary or any other court, provided that he shall not sell any
of my said property during life or widowhood of my said wife,
except by her consent inwriting which shall be evidenced by a
joinder by her in executing deeds and titles to same.
