

Last Will and Testament of Moses M. Smith.

State of Georgia } In the name of
Campbell County } God Amen!
I, Moses M. Smith,
of said State and county, being in feeble
health, but of sound and disposing
mind, and memory, deem it right and
proper that I should make a disposition
of the property which a kind Providence
has blessed me with: I do therefore make
this my last will and testament here-
by revoking all others by me heretofore
made.

Item 1st. I desire and direct that my body be
buried in a decent and Christianlike
manner suitable to my circumstances
in life; my soul I trust will return
to rest with God who gave it, as I
hope for salvation through the merits
and atonement of the Blessed Lord and
Savior Jesus Christ.

Item 2nd. I desire and direct that all my
property, both real and personal be given
to my beloved wife Louisa C. Smith,
with power to sell and dispose of the same,
to collect all my debts, and make such
disposition of the same as she may
think best, believing as I do that she
will do equal justice to all the parties;
and the balance of my property remain-
ing at her death unsold or disposed of, I
desire to be equally divided between
my five children to wit: Wilson L.
Camp and his wife Mary T. Camp
to have one share; and Martha C. Smith,
John T. Smith, Eugenia C. Smith and
Moses M. Roy Smith, and in case the
said property should be sold the proceeds
thereof shall also be divided equally as
above mentioned, provided the same is in

testament.
