Willoughby shall have during her natural life the use of the house in which we live together with all the land on the South side of the creek known as Mud creek, said land being a part of lot of land No 210 of originally Carroll now Douglas County Georgia.

Second, I order and desire that after the death of my wife Amanda M. Willoughby, that all of my property not hereinafter mentioned shall be sold and the proceeds disposed of as shall be directed further in this will.

Third, I desire and order that as soon after my death as convenient that my executors take possession of all my property both real and personal except that disposed of in item No one and after paying all honest debts that I may owe together with the expenses of my sickness and burial and sell all of my said property, in the best manner that he can and the proceeds of the same together with all ready money I may die possessed of and divide the same among my children in the following manner, To my son Thomas A. Willoughby and my daughter Ledger the wife of Wm. Kennedy, both of the State of Texas and my daughter Emma wife of A. J. Nally of Carroll County Ga each the sum of Fifty Dollars in cash.

I order and desire that after paying the said debts that the balance of my estate be divided share and share alike among my other children, William J. Willoughby, Louisa

Fourth: I order and desire that my son
William J. Willoughby and my son-in-law
W^m H. Wally act as the executors of this
my last will,
