posing mind and memory, do make
this my last will and testament.

First - I desire and instruct that all
the obligations and debts that I have
incurred and made or any that I
may make or incur before I die, be
fully paid and satisfied.

Second I will and direct that my daughter
Lucie the wife of Frank Brooks, and
Peggy the wife of Frank Burnett each to
have two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00)
in lieu of what I have given my other two
children, namely L. G. Camp and H. A. Winters
wife, said two hundred & fifty dollars each
to be paid after all my other debts, burial
expenses and medical attention has been
satisfied or as soon thereafter as said
amount can be raised or my executor:
said amount to be raised by selling all
of my stock and farming tools and such
thing. This is not to include any house
furniture.

Third I direct that all the household and
kitchen furniture be divided into four
equal shares and that my four children,
L. G. Camp, Lucie Brooks, Eugenia Winters,
and Peggy Burnett draw or cast lots
for said parcels of furniture.

Fourth I direct that all my land be divided
into four equal shares without reference
to the buildings thereon and that L. G.
Camp my son, to have and to hold the
share on which is situated the dwellings
and tenement houses as he has built
and kept them in repair from his own
prouds and his faithful attendance to
his mother and father, the other three
to be drawn for or lots cast after my death.

Fifth I direct that my son L. G. Camp have all
the proceeds accumulated on my estate

for caring for me in my old age.

Sixth I direct that I be laid to rest or buried by my dear and beloved wife Mary and that my burial be in accordance to my financial circumstances.

Seventh I will and direct that my daughter Peggy Burnett's share of my estate to revert back to my other children Lucie Brooks Eugenie Winters and L. G. Camp should the said Peggy die without any children being born unto to her.

Eighth I will and direct that my son L. G. Camp be and is hereby made my executor of my last will and testament, without bond.

Further I state that all the barbed wire on my land belongs to my son L. G. Camp he having paid for same this the fifth (5th) day of September 1910
Wilson L. Camp.
