I, William A. Howell of said State and County being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Clara P. Howell the use of all my real estate for and during her natural life or widowhood, she to have full control of the same and to have use and enjoy all the rents and profits of the land during her natural life or widowhood.

Item 2nd.

At the death or future marriage of my wife Clara P. Howell, all of my real estate is to be equally divided between my children to-wit: L. L., A. M., W. V., S. V., H. G. and P. T. Howell, Mrs. C. O. Loyd, Mrs. C. S. Blair, Mrs. L. W. Turner, Mrs. J. D. Campbell and Mrs. D. S. Mayfield.

Item 3rd.

If either of my sons or daughters should die before the death or future marriage of my wife, and such deceased son or daughter should leave no heirs at law, surviving him or her, then it is my Will and I so direct that the amount going to such heir, shall be equally divided among the remaining heirs of my estate.

Item 4th.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Clara P. Howell all my personal property consisting of money, notes, accounts, live stock, wagons, buggies, household and kitchen furniture, and all other personal property of every kind and description during her life or widowhood.

Item 5th.

I hereby constitute and appoint my son Albert M. Howell, Executor of this my Last Will and Testament

and I direct that he do not be required to give any bond or security as Executor and that he do not be required to make any annual Returns to the Ordinary.
