restored to her, all the property I ever received
by her. It is my will that she have two
Hundred dollars out of my Estate but to
claim, in the nature of a Power or otherwise
the said sum since of her own accord
released all claims in writing But I still
give her the two hundred dollars to be paid
by my executors after my Death

Item 4 I give and bequeath to each of my seven
Grand Children, the Children of my Deceased
Daughter Mary Johnson each the sum of
fifty Dollars I also to my two Grand
Children the Children of my daughter Rachel
Johnson each fifty dollars To be paid them
immediately after my death which are account of
advances heretofore made is all they are to have
of my Estate
