be buried in the family burial ground. And ^{www.georgiapioneers.com}
my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows.
First all of my expenses to be paid - Then the residue
of my Estate consisting of one bed & bedding
and stool, one mattress and House hold and
kitchen furniture - my notes, accounts & money
&c. of which I may be seized and possessed
at the time of my death and after the settle-
ment of my expenses, the remainder to be
equally divided between my three Grand Children
Nathan R. Pickle, James H. Pickle, Jacob J. Pickle,
and in case any of my said Grand sons should
die, their portion to be equally divided between
the survivors or survivor. And I do here by appoint
Sheldon H. Pickle & David L. Pickle my Executors
of this my last will & Testament. In witness
whereof I Charity Odum have to this will con-
sisted of one half sheet paper set my hand
& Seal, this 20th day of Feb 1868.

& harness. One listed sow & four shoats, the double
manual Frying & all my House hold & Kitchen fu-
niture for & during her natural life
