for all men to die I therefore make this my last will
and testament hereby revoking all wills made by me
heretofore

Early County Wills

1839-1895

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1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and
christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and
condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with
God who gave it and I hope for eternal salvation through
the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed and I hope I
have enjoyed many years.

2nd I desire that all my just debts shall be paid forthwith
by my executor.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Theresa Rebecca
Myers two negroes and viz a woman about twenty one years
of age Cook a boy about two years of age during her natural
life and at her death to her children on her body by either
said said estate not to be subject to levy or sale also I give
one feather bed and one Blanket.

4th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah L. Lee one negro
woman viz about sixteen years of age, and her child a child
about three months of age and feather bed and furniture and
side board during her natural life and at her death to
her children on her body by either her life estate in said
property not to be subject to levy or sale.

5th I give and bequeath unto my son John Lee one

boy Isaac about sixteen years of age, he the said John is
not to have said negro boy until after the death of the said
William & give and bequeath unto my daughter Thursa R.
Museum Sarah the lot of land with in the City of New
York now live to have and to hold the said lot of land so
long as Sarah the shall live single and so long as Thursa
R Museum shall live apart from her present husband
or many any other person or either of them my
intention being to provide a home for them until they
marry or depart this life

I then give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth
all my personal & real estate (after deducting the above
named special legacies) to have and to hold during her
life or marriage and at her death to be equally divided
amongst my five daughters (wit) Martha Lin, Sarah Elizabeth
P Bettha Thompson Museum Sarah the & Thursa R Museum
All my sons Benj the Zadock W the Elmer D the David Lee
John the having received their equal proportion of my
estate herebefore

I then hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife
Elizabeth the Elmer D the my last will and
testament signed 1839-1895 and published in the
presence of us the witnesses who subscribe
our names here to in the presence of the said testator
at his request and in the presence of each other.
