memory and knowing that I am appointed  
for all mankind & therefore make this my last will  
and testament hereby revoking all wills made by me  
Antepon Early County Wills  
1839-1895  
I desire and doth the true better convenience in a decent and  
Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and  
condition in life, my soul & trust shall return to rest with  
God who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through  
the merits and atonement of the blessed Jesus and Savior  
Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed and I hope I  
have enjoyed many years.

I desire & direct that all my just debts shall be paid forthwith  
by my Executor.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Thresa Rebecca  
Myers two negroes to wit Negy, a woman about twenty one years  
of age & John a boy about two years of age during her natural  
life and at her death to her children on her body begotten  
These said negroes not to be subject to her or sold after giving  
one feather bed & one Piano out.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah J. Lee one negro  
woman Negy about sixteen years of age, and her child Chamay  
about three months of age one feather bed & furniture and  
Side board during her natural life and at her death to  
her children on her body begotten her life estate in said  
property not to be subject to her or sale.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Lee one

boy Isaac about sixteen years of age, he the said John is  
not to have said negro boy until after the third death  
of Cotton & give and bequeath unto my daughter Anna H.  
Moses & Sarah. The lot of land held in the said wife's name  
I now leave her and to hold the said lot of land so  
long as Sarah & she shall live single and to my daughter Anna  
A widow shall live apart from her present husband  
or marry any other person or either of them may  
intention being to provide a home for them until they  
marry or depart this life.

Cotton & give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth  
In all my personal & real estate after deducting the above  
named special legacies to have and to hold during her  
life or widowhood and at her death to be equally divided  
amongst my five daughters viz Martha, Anna, Elizabeth,  
Sarah, Temperance, Anna, Sarah, Anna & Moses R. Moses.  
All my rents, Roy's, the Product of the Clerks & Tax Collector  
John Lee having received this equal proportion of my  
estate hitherto.

I then hereby constitute and appoint my second wife  
Elizabeth Lee Clerk of the County Court, to sign this my last will and  
testament signed 1839-1895 and published in the presence of us the subscribers who subscribe  
our names hereunto in the presence of the said testator  
at his request and in the presence of each other.
