- 2nd I desire am direct that all my just debts be paid and
delay by my executors herein mentioned and affirmed

3rd I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Jane of
one hundred & 1839-1895 pieces of land set aside
a part of lot of land bounded on the East by
(286) same known as the Home place in the 6th section
of Early County together with all the right minerals and
appurtenances thereto belonging also fifty five
and a half acres of land on the West side of same again
a part of lot of land bounded 285 in the 6th section of Early County
together with all the produce I may have honored during
Standing in the field also two Horses or mares and one head
of Cattle such as She may Select from my whole stock also
my buggy, wagon, Sufar Mill and kettle of farming utensils
Gins and all the implements thereto. House to be a kitchen furniture
and all the money and notes I may have at my death
all of the above specified to which is this the third section I
devise to my Daughter Mary Ann Penelope & Sager at the
death of my wife Mary on the following conditions to
that the said Mary Ann Penelope & Sager shall remain again
here in a State of Co-habitation with William & Sager but if she
the said Mary Ann Penelope & Anna William & Sager live together as man
and wife either before or after the death of my wife Mary then the
said property to be equally divided equally among my other
children

- 4th) I give and bequeath one share to Mrs Emily Douglass wife of
my son Irvin B Douglass and his three youngest children a certain
piece of land in the 6th District of Early County and known in the
plan of said District as lot number (267) containing two hundred
and fifty acres more or less
- 5th) I give and bequeath one share to my daughter Mrs. Louisa A.
Haddock wife of William Haddock my other house and lot dwelling
and lots, and the lot which the Blacksmith Shop is situated
all of said property being in Dawson's and known as the
Douglass Town property
- 6.) I give and bequeath one share to my sons William George John
Drake and James Eliasha Douglass and my Douglass's
Mrs Alexander Sykes one half, then divided as follows
and my three grand children Mr. Wm. Lewis Perry and Mrs
and Washington Williams all the stock and other property
which I have not disposed of in the previous section
said property to be equally divided between the heirs above mentioned
the William Children to inherit one share
- 7) I hereby appoint my Sons John Drake and James Eliasha Douglass
