circumstances and condition, my Soul I trust shall be
brought to rest with God, who gave it, as I hope for
Eternal life and Salvation through the blessed Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion I have profess-
ed and as I humbly trust enjoyed twenty eight years.
Item Second; I desire and direct that all my just debts
be paid without delay by my executor hereafter named.

Item Third, I give and devise to Joel W. Perry, five
dollars in Trust for all the Children of the said Joel
W. Perry by a former wife to them and their heirs forever,

Item Fifth I give and devise to Jesse Collier, five
dollars in Trust for all the Children of the said Jesse

Item Sixth I give and devise to my beloved Daughter
Elizabeth Sutton five dollars to her and her children
for ever,

Item Seventh, I give and devise to my beloved Grand-
son free to G. Collier, Negro man thirty two years old
dark complexion, Negro Woman Cenny about forty nine
years of age dark complexion, Negro Boy Oller
about twelve years old, a Negro Boy Gack, nine
years old, and also two thousand dollars seven
Interest in notes and money the proceeds arising
from the sale of two lots of land lying jointly in
Early but now Calhoun County the one hundred
and eighty nine (189) and one hundred and ninety
(190) in the fourth district of said County sold to

Doctor A. D. Shoemaker in 1854, and also all of my other property of whatever it may be consisting of ready money, Notes and accounts, Hogs, and Cattle, Horse hold and Kitchen Furniture, and whatever I may hereafter be possessed, & of to him and his heirs forever,

Item Eighth I constitute and appoint my trusty friend, Jure Collier Executor of this my last Will and Testament, This 27th of October 1854,
