Early County W Alexander being of sound mind and do make
the following disposition of my property to wit I give all my
personal property lands money and my negroes and such
as I shall here after see good to my wife Emily Alexander
during her widow hood and in the event of her not coming to
take the child's part I give to my son Asa L Alexander
Patience Ann Mike two hundred dollars in cash I give
to my son George W Alexander Sally Rachael & Esther two
hundred dollars in cash I give to my Daughter Mary
Ann the sum of \$500 I give to my son Manly
Taylor Alexander Eudora Mariah Reuben I give to my
grand child Sumford Alexander John Abby Lydia and
after my wife Emily Alexander death the property in her pos-
session to be equally divided amongst the above named heirs
I appoint my son Asa L Alexander and George W Alexander
to be executors to this my last will and testament.

State of Georgia In the name of God Amen
Early County I Indacis Alexander being conscious of
my mortality and being in sound mind and memory do hereby
constitute and declare the following to be my last
will and testament to be performed after my death
In the first place I recommend my body to the care of nature and my
soul to him who created it.
I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary Alexander during her
natural life a negro man named Sam his wife Fanny and a
negro man named Adam and a woman named Fieda and the
lot in Fort Gaines together with the improvements thereon and land
situated on the west side of the public street and bounded
by Mrs. P. Towns South by Daniel F. Henderson East and by

also four cows and calves also such other stock as she chooses to keep
also one bay mare Two for the beds and furniture and such part
at the house held furniture as she keeps

3rd I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Alexander S. Johnson
Two negro men now in his possession and the property he has hereafter
receiving all amounting to fifteen hundred dollars

4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved son John D. Campbell, Mary
Sarah James Johnson daughter of James to Son Alexander to be
to be paid by the executor at her marriage or on her coming of age
turning one year of age five hundred dollars provided she has
nothing to make against me or a suit now pending in the Superior
Court of Randolph County against me in favor of Benjamin
Easley as administrator but the right of his wife Jane Easley
I withdraw my son James to Alexander his part off and myself defend
want and in the event of a recovery being had against me no part
case it is to be a full payment of the whole five hundred dollars which
five hundred added to the five hundred and thirty four before paid
my son in his lifetime amounting to all to Alexander's hundred and thirty
five dollars which is the full amount I give and bequeath to the heirs
of my son James to Alexander's hundred and thirty five dollars and also that my
said grand daughter John D. Campbell this life without child or
children this and in her life and after her death to be divided equally to
next to and become the joint property of my other heirs and legatees
to my estate subject to be equally divided among them

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5th I give and bequeath unto my son Brockman and his heirs
negro man named Jerry now in his possession supposed to worth
six hundred dollars also one lot of land by Saw Rocks and his heirs
and heirs now in his possession as well as all other property now
in his possession supposed to be worth fifteen hundred dollars

6th I give and bequeath unto my son John D. Johnson and
negro man named Bill one lot of land on the falls of Polk
in Randolph County and other property hereafter to be paid to the
amount of fifteen hundred dollars

7th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Clementine
a negro woman named Peggy and her three children and her present
increases and other property now in her possession supposed to be worth
fifteen hundred dollars

8th I give and bequeath unto her heirs and to my daughter Mary
Ann Amanda Johnson a negro woman named Abby and
her three children and future increases of any and other property
now in her possession to the amount of fifteen hundred dollars

Said sons of left appoints Brockman Johnson and his heirs and legatees in the
same

that I give and bequeath unto my Special Son Lewis Henderson
 my negro to wit John a Negro the said Lewis Henderson
 my son at the age of 21 years and I give and bequeath to my son at the age of 21
 years the one acre lot which is now occupied by the said Lewis Henderson
 on the west side of the main street here and which the late I owned
 and in said lot there was a house and stable which was his father's
 father and sister have already received and supposed to be worth 500
 hundred dollars But in the event of his dying before this time without child
 or children the whole is to revert to my other legatee to be having the same
 which I the same to remain in the care of his mother and thereabout
 this will until he is a man to twenty one years of age

11th As my negro ~~servant~~ Sam has been a true and faithful slave
 for many years I will that at the end of twenty four years from the date that
 he is discharged from servitude for that time and for him to remain
 for many days of his life under the guardianship of the executors of this
 will but from any further cause it should be necessary to him himself
 before the end of the twenty four years it is my wish for his wife Mary
 and child to be bound with him and then not separate But Mary
 and her child and her own wife to remain slaves

12th It is my will that after my death the remainder of my property
 not disposed of the first be disposed of by the executors of this
 will by sale or otherwise www.georgiapioneers.com just as to the remainder
 be equally divided among the legatee except my ~~son~~ daughter who
 is full and finally and provided for in the 11th Item

13th I hereby constitute and appoint my son Brockman Henderson
 and John H. Suttles my executors to execute this my last will in
 terms of the law in such case made and provided
 I am under my seal and dated this 5th day of March in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six (1836)
