 his the said Melts last sickness, that said
 James R. Melts then called upon me to witness
 that after the payment of all of his debts he
 wished to give to his Mother, Mrs Martha Melts
 his Land and all other property of which he
 should die possessed, and he wish me to come out
 the same to witness. I Elisha Harrison was with
 said James R. Melts on the 2nd day of April
 1862, at Camp Brown near Savannah Esq. said Melts
 was then sick with the sickness of which he died
 in Early County on the 20th day of May 1862. said
 James R. Melts then called upon me to wit-
 ness that he gave to his Mother, Mrs Martha Melts
 his Land, & all of his other property after the pay-
 ment of his just debts. I, Mrs Martha Greenwood
 was present at the house of Mr James R.
 Melts on the 18th day of May 1862, it being dur-
 ing the last sickness of James R. Melts of which
 sickness he died on the 20th Inst. said James R.
 Melts then and there called upon me to witness
 that he gave to his Mother his Land and all of
 the property after his just debts were paid. We
 each state that at the time that we were called
 on as above stated said James R. Melts appeared
 to us in possession of his mental faculties, and
 that said Melts died in Early County Esq. on
 second day of May 1862. said James M. Melts
 said to each of us at the time of calling on
 us as above that he wanted his Brothers then
 as M. Melts to manage the business as execu-
 tor for him

 life from this world deem it well and proper
 both in it respects myself and my family
 that I should make a disposition of the property
 with which a kind Providence has blessed me with
 I therefore make this my last will and testament
 hereby revoking all and annulling all others heretofore
 made by me
 I hereby give and direct that my body
 be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
 suitable to my circumstances and condition, My
 soul I trust shall return to rest with God who
 gave it
