Martha Greenwood of Early County Ga were  
present during the last sickness of James R  
Mells who died in Early County Ga on the  
twentieth day of May 1862. James McCall-  
um was with said James R Mells at his  
House on the 17th day of May 1862 and among  
his the said Mells last sickness, that said it  
James R Mells then called upon me to witness  
that after the payment of all of his debts he  
wished to give to his Mother, Mrs Martha McCall-  
um his Land and all other property of which he  
should die possessed, and he wished me to cover up  
the same to writing. Elisha Garrison was with  
said James R Mells on the 2nd day of June  
1862, at Camp Brown near Savannah Ga said Mells  
was then sick with the sickness of which he died  
in Early County Ga on the 20th day of May 1862 said  
James R Mells 1839-1893 then called upon me to witness  
that he gave [www.georgiapioneers.com](http://www.georgiapioneers.com) he should die  
his land, & all of his other property after the pay-  
ment of his just debts. Mrs Martha Greenwood  
was present at the house of Mr James R  
Mells on the 18th day of May 1862 & being dur-  
ing the last sickness of James R Mells of which  
sickness he died on the 20th Inst, said James R  
Mells then and there called upon me to witness  
that he gave to his Mother his land and all of  
the property after his just debts were paid, &  
each stated that at that time that we were called  
on as above stated said James R Mells appeared  
to us in possession of his usual faculties, and  
that said Mells died in Early County Ga on  
second day of May 1862 said James R Mells  
said to each of us at the time of calling on  
us as above, that he wanted his brother John  
- ad Mells to manage the business as exec-  
utor for him
