ing when I may have to pay his debt of nature, do make & leave
this my last will & testament in manner and form as follows
1st I Will that all my last debt be paid as soon as practicable or
convenient.

2nd I Will or desire that my Daughter Martha & Leath have one
hundred Dollars as all her interest in my estate.

3rd I Will that my son John S. Glenn have three Negroes (viz)
Henry, Frank and Helen, and a good horse or one hundred & twenty
five Dollars; a good bridle and Saddle, a feather bed and fur
niture, also first choice of my stock of cattle in a cow & calf,
also a good suit of superfine cloth & clothes, also provisions for
himself and his the first year.

4th I Will to my son James F. Glenn three Negroes (viz) Litter
Key, Alfred and Bony, a good horse or one hundred and
twenty five Dollars; a good Saddle, bridle, a feather bed &
furniture, also a good cow & calf and a suit of superfine
cloth & clothes, and provisions for himself & his the first year.

5th I Will to my Daughter Mary R. Glenn three Negroes (viz)
Robert, Spencer and George, a good horse or one hundred &
twenty five Dollars, a good bridle & saddle, a feather bed
and furniture, a good cow & calf, also a good suit of moun-
ing apparel, and provision for herself and hers the first year,
to belong to her and the lawful heirs of her body.

6th I Will to my son George W. Glenn three Negroes (viz) William
Edmond and Louinda, also a good horse or one hundred & twenty
five Dollars, a good bridle and saddle, a feather bed & furni-
ture, a good cow & calf, a suit of superfine cloth & clothes, a good
English Education and provisions for himself & his the first year.

7th I Will to my beloved Wife Sarah Glenn six Negroes (viz) old
e Nepton, Joe, Big e Key, Litter Nepton, Lewis Litter Williams, & my
little spent of land in the fifth Dist of Early Co. No 381, frac-
tion No 401, also one lot of land in Cherokee Testament dist of the
second Section, also my Carriage and Horses & mules, farming
implements, also my stock of cattle and Hogs; to be held during her
natural life and at her death to be equally divided between my
four youngest children (viz) John S. Glenn, James F. Glenn, Susan
R. Glenn and George W. Glenn.

8th I Will that if either of the four youngest children die without
any heir, that their property be divided among the other three.

9th I Will also that if either of the Negroes above given to any
of the children die before they marry or become of age, that

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then shall be one of equal value put in its place from my estate.
10 I Will and desire that all the children and their property remain together until they become of age or marry and that all that made over a support to be added to my estate.

11th And lastly I Will that Sarah Glenn, John L. Glenn and James A. Glenn attend to this my last will and testament for the purpose of carrying it into effect May 30 1840
