Georgia - I James H Taylor being of sound
Clark County 3^d and disposing mind and memory
convinced of the uncertainty of life &
the possibility of death at any stage of life and
being anxious to dispose of my property after death
in a manner different from the distribution made
by Law of make and constitute this to be my last
Will and Testament

I the 1st It is my will and desire that my land
and all personalty which Jane H Taylor shall re-
tain and possess me from any possible interest
of mine all the property which she possessed
previous to our marriage including the following
agreed purchased with her jewels since our
marriage, viz: one about fifty years old, ~~there~~
45 feet by 35 feet 27 bushels \$5, Plat 23, Plat
Belle Starry Dr Paul 19 March 15, Adam

55
And Dick 4 years old, shall agree to remain on the Plantation and Work with the balance until the last distribution wherein of he provided for.

Item 3rd until the arrival of my youngest Child to the age of Twenty one provided my wife remains so long unmarried & still and bequeath to my wife annually the sum of One Thousand Dollars to be paid out of the proceeds of my Plantation or other sources as my executors may provide; after the Marriage of my wife or the arrival of my youngest Child of age my will and desire is that my executors pay to my wife for her Support use and benefit during her natural life annually the sum of five hundred dollars.

Item 4th My Will is that my wife shall have the use and control of my House and lot in Athens and the furniture thereof together with the house servants during her life or widowhood free from any rent, charge for the same, the vacant lot to the adjoining I give and bequeath to my son Rubin upon his arrival at age, to be estimated as a part of his share of my estate,

Item 5th My Will is that during the minority of my children all my property shall be kept together, and the proceeds applied to the payment of my just debts, the annual herein before bequeathed, and the support & Education of my children.

Item 6th I will and bequeath all of my property besides the above consisting of two thousand acres of land in Early County 950 acres in the 28th land 500 in the 4th Rish the negroes and other personal property slaves, tools, cattle and all other rights and credits, together with all other property I may hereafter acquire by transfer etc to my children.

Robert and James D. and such others as may be
after be born'd to me of my wife, James H. Taylor to be
equally divided between them at each of my children or
twos or age my wish is that he may receive his prop-
erty of my Estate each at his age obligating himself
in such manner as my executors may prescribe to
pay his proportionate share of the annuity hereinbefore
bequeathed, my wish is that my children shall each
receive their share specifically, that is a portion of
the land and a share of the negroes, which property
I wish my children to keep and not dispose of, till
the event of the death of either of my children
without leaving a child of their own, my will is that
the property herein bequeathed revert back to my
surviving children or their lineal descendants,

Item 6th In the event of the death of all my chil-
dren without leaving children of their
own or lineal descendants, my will and desire is
that my property be divided one half to my wife
