I James D. Relcher of the County of Early, and State of Georgia being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make ordain, publish and declare this to be my last Will & Testament, that is to say,

First, after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate Real and personal, I give and dispose of as follows, to wit, I want my beloved Wife & Children to remain on the farm, on which I now reside with all my person Property during the widowhood of my Wife or until my eldest child then living, and the proceeds of the farm appertaining to the payment of my

and the maintenance and education of my children it require so much, and in case of the intermarriage of my wife I leave it discretionary with my executor either to sell or distribute my estate equal between my children and wife, that portion distributed to my wife with the natural increase of the same to return to my children then living and be equally divided among them at her death.

2nd, It is further Willed by me that my aged Mother have the privilege of remaining on my farm during her life if she thinks proper.

3rd, And I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my friend Oran H. Davis executor of this my last Will and testament.
