mind declare and publish as following to be my last
Will and Testaments.

1st After a decent and Christian like Burial I desire
all my just paid and my several legacies I may make.

2nd, All the proceeds of what I have made by my oc-
cupation consisting of Land, Money, Notes, House-
hold and Kitchen furniture, I give to my Daugh-
ter Mary Wife of C. C. Robinson same not being a
Daughter by ties of blood, but by Marriage with a
step son.

3rd, All the effects coming to me from the Estate of my
Father the business of said Estate now in the hands
of A. J. Wheeler of American Co. I want, equally dis-
tributed between the legacies of said Estate.

4th It is my desire that the above mentioned C. S. Whelan, distribute the profits of the Estate of my Father and distribute my share as above.

5th Article 2nd in the above, giving to my Daughters Mary for Ringness and attention in sickness of self and family, all the following or proceeds of the sale, proper to Lot of land No 276 in the 13th district of Sumter County some being pine and containing 200^{sq} acres more or less, money and solvent notes all that I am in possession of at the time of my death, and Buggy and Harnes &c.

6th I hereby constitute and appoints Benjamin W. Tendon Executor of this my last Will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day of March Eighteen hundred and fifty three
