1st thing I desire 1839-1895 that my body be buried in
a decent and convenient manner suitable to my
circumstances and condition in life my soul

2^d thing I desire and direct that of my just debts

appointed as I am unwilling my creditors should
be delayed in their rights

3rd item, I give bequeath and devise to my beloved
wife Nancy the fourt half of lot of land num
ber one hundred and twenty eight in the Sixth district
of Early County during her life and after her death
the same I give to my daughter Nancy Winsor
with all the rights, members and appurtenances to
the said half lot of land in any wise belonging
free from all charge or limitation whatever to her
own proper use benefit and behoof forever with full
power to dispose of the same at any time previous or
by will or deed at her death as she may think proper
4th item. I give bequeath and devise to my son
Zacharias James the worth half of lot of land
number one hundred and twenty eight in the Sixth
