Georgia Early County, 3rd March 1851 In the name of God, a most  
of Early in said State being aged and infirm  
but of sound mind and disposing memory  
do make publick and declare this to be my  
last Will and Testament hereby revoking all  
other Wills or testaments by me heretofore made.  
Item 1st. I give my soul to him that created  
it, and desire that my body be buried in the  
usual Christian style. And that all my just  
debts be paid by my executors hereafter named.

Item 2nd. I give and bequeath unto my Grand  
Daughter Martha Scott wife of Dan Scott and  
to her children now living, and hereafter to be  
born, apart from the control or disposition of  
her husband in any way, Four Hundred and  
fifty Dollars in Money.

Item 3rd. I give and bequeath unto my

grand Daughter Susannah Brantley One hundred Dollars in money.

Item 4th. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Ruth "Bye off One hundred Dollars in money.

Item 5th I give and Bequeath unto the children of my deceased Son John H. Purdy Twenty Dollars in money. Item 6th I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Nancy H. Jenkins wife of Clark Jenkins and to her children now living or that may be hereafter born unto her to their own separate use and benefit free from the control or disposition in any way of her said Husband Clark Jenkins and not subject for any debt now owing by the said Clark or to be hereafter created by him the following etysons built: Lucy a woman about Twenty four years old and her increase, and Henry a girl about three years old and her increase, and Henry a boy about eight years old. And Amanda a girl about six years old and her increase, and Joe a boy about five years old.

Item 7th I give a <sup>Early County Wills</sup> ~~Book~~ unto my Daughter Polly Bennett One <sup>1839-1895</sup> hundred Dollars in money in addition to what I have heretofore given.

Item 8th. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Caroline C. Hale and to her children now living, and that may be hereafter born to them and their own separate use and enjoyment free from the liability of her Husband Percy C. Hale the following etysons built: Harbert a man about Twenty four years old, and Oliver a woman about Twenty years old, and her two children Tom a boy about three years old and aicklas a boy about eight months old, and Oliver's increase, and Tom a boy about eleven two years old, and Alberta a woman about eighteen years old and her increase, and her child Andrew about three weeks old, and Abby a girl about nine years old and her increase.

Item 9th. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Son Joshua H. Harris the following etysons to wit, when he becomes to the age of Twenty one years) Cherry a girl about fifteen years of age and her increase, and Tom a boy about ten years of age, and Washington to a boy about fourteen years of age.

Item 10th I give and Bequeath unto my Grand
