Item 1st I give my soul to him that created it, and desire that my body be buried in the usual Christian style, and that all my just debts be paid by my Executors hereafter named

Item 2nd. I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Martha Scott wife of Jas Scott and to her children now living, and hereafter to be born, apart from the control or disposition of her husband in any way Four Hundred and fifty Dollars in Money.

Item 3rd. I give and Bequeath unto my

grand Daughter Susannah Brantley One hundred Dollars in money.

Item 4th I Give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Ruth Byas One hundred Dollars in money.

Item 5th I Give and Bequeath unto the children of my deceased son John H. Cundy Twenty Dollars in money. Item 6th I Give and Bequeath unto my grand Daughter Nancy J. Jenkins wife of Clark Jenkins and to her children now living or that may be hereafter born unto her to their own separate use and benefit free from the control or disposition in any way of her said husband Clark Jenkins and not subject for any debt now owing by the said Clark or to be hereafter created by him. The following I agree to wit: Lucy a woman about twenty five years old and her increase, and Penny a girl about nine years old and her increase, and Henry a boy about eight years old, and Amanda a girl about six years old and her increase, and Lee a boy about five years old.

Item 7th I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Polly Bennett One hundred Dollars in money in addition to what I have herebefore given her.

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Item 8th I Give and Bequeath unto my grand Daughter Caroline C. Dale and to her children now living, and that may be hereafter born to them and their own separate use and enjoyment free from the liability of her husband Percy C. Dale the following I agree to wit: Harbord a man about twenty four years old, and Allie a woman about twenty years old, and her two children Corn a boy about three years old, and sticklas a boy about eight months old, and Allie's increase, and Colin a boy about eleven years old, and Abertine a woman about eighteen years old and her increase, and her child Purden about three weeks old, and Abby a girl about nine years old and her increase.

Item 9th I Give and Bequeath unto my grand Son Joshua W. Harris the following I agree to wit: (when he becomes to the age of twenty one years) Chiny a girl about fifteen years of age and her increase, and Corn a boy about ten years of age, and Washington a boy about fourteen years of age.

Item 10th I Give and Bequeath unto my grand

In John W Harris the following negroes to wit (when he becomes to the age of twenty one years) Cecelia a girl about fourteen years old and her increase, and Edinburren a boy about nine years old, and Peractia a girl about six years old and her increase.
Item 11th. I give and bequeath unto my grand Daughter Sarah E Harris the following negroes to wit (when she becomes to the age of twenty one years, or when she marries) If she ever should marry the following property shall not be subject to the liabilities of her husband but she and her bodily heirs shall have full control and enjoyment of it, Clathan a boy eleven years old, Burchett a girl about eight years old, and her increase and Ammy a girl about seven years old and her increase, and Eliza Anne a girl about two years old and her increase.

Item 12th. I give and bequeath unto my grand Son Howell J. Harris the following negroes to wit (when he becomes to the age of twenty one years) William a boy nine years old, Chany a girl about eight years old and her increase, and Brenetty a girl about seven years old and her increase.

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Item 13th. I give and bequeath unto my grandson John Harris the following negroes to wit (when he becomes to the age of twenty one years) Angelina a girl four years old and her increase, Garrit a boy two years old, Cordia a girl five years old and her increase.

Item 14th. I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal to unto my Daughter her Companion Anne Harris and her husband Joshua Harris to dispose of at their will and pleasure.

Item 15th. I do hereby constitute and appoint Joshua Harris and Dr J W Holmes both of Early County, Ga. and V. B. Vales of Randolph Co. Ga. my executors to this my last will and Testament.
