riage with Mrs Sarah Phipps, and that he is now dis-

posing that all his estate and effects of every kind and

depth shall go to his children in like manner as

his estate to be secured to his three children at birth, to

them all now to whom these presents shall

come, greeting; that the said Thomas Thompson

and in consideration of the sum of five dollars

to him in hand paid at and before the signing and

delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof being

acknowledged, hath bargained sold and conveyed

and by these presents doth bargain sell and convey

to John Thompson, Thomas Porter in trust for my

three children, viz. Sarah Phipps, Robert Thompson

and Mary Thompson, all of my estate both real and per-

sonal, to wit, my plantation on the Chattoahoochee

River, containing two thousand acres more or less in

the following named places with their improvements, viz.

Wicks, Sand, Maria, Helman, Werry, Green, Franklin,

Prince, Hilsey, Mariah girl, a Palatka, Connell, Little,

Big Mary, Deaton, Cole, Kinnard, Sawyer, Gola, Cole,

Deak, Osace, Sydia, Semantian, Syndie, a Son, Robert,

a Matilda, a Mary Ann, Daniel, Fanny, Ocala a woman

about years old, and all their future increase, and all

others I may own at my death, as well as other lands,

note money, accounts, and all due which I may own

in my right, to have and to hold the same, present and

hereafter, it is the express meaning and intent of the

parties to these presents that the said John Thompson

and Thomas Porter shall stand seized of the aforesaid

property, in trust for the sole use and benefit of the

aforesaid Sarah, Robert, and Mary Thompson,

which shall fall into the Trustees hands at my

the common course of events that I must soon die,
I do hereby make and publish this my last and
full and final Testament, hereby revoking all others before
made by me,

1st Item I do give and direct that my body be
buried in the usual Christian manner, my soul I leave
to rest with God who gave it.

2nd Item I do give and direct that all my debts
shall be paid by my executor or by his appointed

3rd Item I give and bequeath to my child Sarah
Susan Anne Woodruff wife of William Woodruff two hundred
dollars in money.

4th Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah
Susan Anne Woodruff two hundred dollars in money.

5th Item I give and bequeath to my daughter

money, besides paying all of her bills that may come
this year for her maintenance or otherwise out of
