his estate to be deemed to his three Children at his death.

Know all men by whom these presents shall
come, greeting; that the said Robert Thompson son,
and in Consideration of the sum of five dollars
to him in hand paid at and before the sealing and
delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof having
acknowledged, hath bargained sold and bargained
and by these presents to the buyer, to sell and convey over
to, John Thompson, his wife, in trust for my
three Children, aforesaid, and to their heirs and assigns
and their Wives, all of my whole both real and
personal estate, my plantation on the Chattooga River
River, containing two thousand acres more or less, in
the following named slaves with their increase of my
Wife, Anna, Maria, Newman, Jerry, Green, Franklin,
Prince, Silsey, a Mariah girl, a Nativity, Bennett, Little,
Big Alton, Deacon, Joe, William, James, Bela, John,
Sarah, Isaac, Lydia, Sebastian, Eugene, Ann, Rose,
Natilda, a Mary Ann, Quinl, Gunby, Clara a woman
about years old, one acre of land, increase, and all
others it may contain at my death, as well as other lands
polar money, accounts, and all dues which I may own
in my right, to have and to hold the same, for ever
or during, it is the express meaning and intent of the
parties to these presents that the said John Thompson
and others aforesaid shall stand seized of the aforesaid
property, in trust for the sole use and benefit of the
aforesaid Martha, Robert, and Mary Thompson,
which shall fall into the Trustees hands at my

do make and publish this my last and
final will and Testament hereby revoking all others by me

made against me being of advanced age but of sound
ment and digesting memory and knowing from
the common course of events that it must shortly in
this life be made and publish that my last and
will and Testament hereby revoking all others by me

wherefore I desire and direct that my body be
buried in the usual Christian manner my soul I be
surely received to rest with God who gave it.

2nd Item I desire and direct that all my just
debt be paid by my executor way he appointed
3rd Item I give and bequeath to my child Georgia
Susan Jane Ward wife of William G. Ward two hundred
dollars in money.

4th Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna
daughter of Landis Stevenson her son wife of Benjamin
Weller one hundred dollars in money.

5th Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter
Sarah Elizabeth Stevenson two hundred dollars in
money besides paying all of her debts that may accrue
this year for her maintenance or otherwise out of
