

Georgia On the name of God, Amen,
Early County I, Sarah, widow of the County
and State aforesaid sensible of my approaching his

solution, grievously afflicted in body, but possessed
fully of my intellectual faculties, of his power, memory
and sound mind and judgment, do hereby make and
declare this instrument to be my last Will and Testament.

First I resign my mortal frame to the dust
without much pomp and ostentation, preferring
to be buried in a plain though decent manner.
Secondly - I resign my soul to God who gave it, with
a firm reliance on his promises, and a hope of etern-
al immortality beyond the grave.

Item 1st. After all my just debts are paid off, and
the sum of one hundred Dollars for the services and
troubles etc. of my executor, I dispose of my property in
the following manner, to wit; I bequeath to my nephew
Richard Grimese Harris, my negro man Nathan
about Sixty years Early County Wills ^{since his} about fifty
years of age, and ¹⁸³⁹⁻¹⁸⁹⁵ give him nineteen years old.
also my present residence, my Hills and Woods an-
tiguous to the same containing two lots of about Two
hundred acres lying in the 6th District of said County.
Item 2nd. I bequeath to my nephew William Harris
my negro man Adam about 45 years of age, also a
man called Billy 60 years of age, and my dark colored
Horse Cyro.

Item 3rd. I bequeath to my nephew Joseph L. Harris
the large stone Wall face house of mine which I recently
purchased from a Kentuckian, and my lot of land call-
ed the Weaver lot in this District and County, the num-
ber of which is not recollectec.

Item 4th. I also give to my beloved niece Sarah Ann
Harris my mare Whidley, and a good feather Bed and
furniture.

Item 5th. I also give and bequeath to my nephew Tho-
mas Harris my mare Fanny, and my entire stock of
cattle, and my flock of sheep.

Item 6th. I also give and bequeath unto my nephews
William & Harris all my household furniture with the
exception of the Bed above described including sideboard
beds- and bedsteads- chests, trunks &c with

the stock of Hogs and Sheep.

Item 7th. I also give and bequeath unto my nephews
Walter Green & Co. my Negro woman Elmira with her
eight children with Walling, Arthur, Remond, Dan-
iel, Wm. Brack, Edward Richard, and his wife.

Lastly, I do hereby appoint and constitute my
grand daughter Elmira as my Executor to see my last
will and testament, with an abiding confidence
in her judgment, to see that the provisions of the same
are faithfully executed according to my wishes as
above expressed.

The Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal this 12th Day of March 1850. Wm. Galtman
