### The Residue of Estate given

This is the last Will and Testament of Dan'l C. Wilson, of the  
County of Early and State of Georgia. Considering of the uncertainty  
of life, and knowing that all men must die, I do will and direct as follows:

1 I do will and direct, that after my death, my body shall be decently buried according to the funeral usages of the country in which  
I live.

2 I do will and direct that all my just debts be paid as soon as the  
law will permit, and the same can be done without ~~any~~ necessary sac-  
rifice to my estate.

3 I Give and devise to my dear wife Margaret Wilson, all of the  
lot or tract of land known as number three hundred and sixty three, in the  
fifth District of the County of Early, and on which I now live, not  
already sold, bargained, and disposed of by me, and except such lots, parts  
and portions of the same as I may sell, bargain, and dispose of during  
my life - Also one Negro woman slave named Patty, and her

five children, Sam, Mary, Ellen, Charles and Lucia, and her and their future increase. Also one Mahogany Secretary and Bookcase, one Painted pine Bedstead, Head and junction, one painted pine Table, and one painted pine Chest. I also give and devise to my said wife, all the residue and remainder of my estate of every kind and description what ever, whether real, personal, or mixed, and whether the same shall consist in lands, slaves, Stock of all kinds, furniture, goods, chattels, notes, or accounts which at the time of my death may belong to me, or which I may be interested in or entitled unto. I make this provision for my said wife, because we have no children to provide for, and because for all the worldly goods which I have acquired, she has borne her full share of toil and care, and therefore is more justly entitled to them than any one besides. And I do well and sincerely that my Executors place my estate aforesaid, as soon as the same can be done according to law, in the peaceful possession of my dear wife Margaret Wilson, and that she shall have the absolute control, management and disposal of the same as to her shall seem meet and proper and that the same rest in her and her heirs forever.

And I do nominate, constitute and appoint William Costleberg, and William A. Bethea, Executors of this my will.

And lastly, I do revoke all former will by me at any time before made, and declare this 1839-1895 [www.georgiapioneers.com](http://www.georgiapioneers.com) my last will and testament. In witness whereof, I have written my last will, contained on one sheet of paper, set my hand and seal, this first day of February in the year of our Lord 1844.
