 I Thomas Haynes of the County of Warren and State of Georgia being of sound mind and memory do make this
 my last will and Testament, and do hereby nomin-
 ate and appoint my two sons Charles & John Haynes
 and Thomas Haynes and my son-in-law James Ryan
 Executors to this my last Will and Testament.

First I give and bequeath to my son Charles & Haynes
 his share and assigns one Boy Slave named Harry
 son of Phillis,

I give and bequeath unto my son Thom-
 as Haynes to his heirs and assigns one Boy Slave
 named Harry son of Phillis,

I give and bequeath unto my two sons Charles &
 and Thomas in trust for the use and benefit of
 my Daughter Catharine Bonner and her children the
 sum of three hundred dollars, to be made out of
 my Estate not herein specially disposed of, the said
 sum of money to be laid out for the use and
 benefit of my said daughter and children by the
 said Charles & Haynes

Early County Wills

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I give and bequeath unto my daughter Frances Bonner
 during her natural life, a girl Slave named Fanny daugh-
 ter of Genda and after the death of the said Frances, I
 will the said Slave Fanny with her increase to the chil-
 dren of the said Frances and to their heirs and assigns
 and I do hereby place the said Slave under the manage-
 ment and control of the said Charles & Haynes &
 Thomas Haynes as trustees for the said Frances and
 her children,

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Ryan
 and to her heirs and assigns, a man Slave named Dick
 son of Genda,

I give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Elizabeth Robinson during her natural life a woman
 Slave named Genda and a girl Slave named Vilib
 daughter of Genda and after the death of my said
 daughter Elizabeth I bequeath the said two Slaves
 with their increase to the children of the said Elizabeth
 to them their heirs and assigns, and I do hereby place
 the said two Slaves under the management and control
 of the said Charles & Haynes and Thomas Haynes as trustees
 for the said Elizabeth and her children

I give to my daughter Susannah Livingston and her
a Boy named Elbert son of Phillis.

~~I give and bequeath to my son Wm. Bayne~~
Haynes, and to his heirs and assigns, the Tract and
Tracts of Land on which I now live including the
adjoining Tracts belonging to me, the whole estimated
at two hundred ~~Acres~~ acres, be the same more
or less, also a Boy Slave named Charles, and a girl
named working lass, and six silver Tea Spoons.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Martha
H. Bayne and to her heirs and assigns the follow-
ing Slaves to wit, a man named Baitlett, a girl nam-
ed Charlott, a Woman named Phillis, a Woman named
Harinda, and a girl named a ~~boy~~, also six silver
Tea Spoons, a quilted gown, glass and a pair of
Plated Canthsticks.

The rest and residue of my Estate after paying
of my just debts and legacies, I give in equal
distribution to all my children, then living and as to
yet, But that proportion which may fall to my
daughters, Catharine, ^{Early County Wills} and Elizabeth. I leave
in trust for them ¹⁸³⁹⁻¹⁸⁹⁵ and sent Charles
to and Thomas.

My executors may dispose of my lands in the
County of Wayne either at public or private sale
signed sealed and delivered the twenty fifth
of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred
and twenty three (1823) in presence of
