

Early County October 23 1866

A Certificate of the last wishes of William Bailey as to the disposition of the property of which he died possessed made verbally by him to the undersigned on the twentyfourth day of October eight hundred and sixty seven

I wish up on a blue turn of papers belonging to me in the hands of possession of William McCreary a part of a disposition made by me within some time back that I am giving it to him and that he Milton McCreary a blind legally to the disposition of my property I wish furthermore that all that I have been legally divided and that one half of it be given to the children of Milton McCreary and the other half to the children of Mrs A. M. Bailey widow of my deceased brother

In open court personally came Milton McCreary Julian Hanson and Elliott Bailey who being duly sworn said that they were called on by William Bailey during his last sickness to bear in mind that the declaration contained in the paper presented as the last will and testament of said William Bailey was his last will and testament and that he had a sound mind and memory and that it was freely voluntarily and without any constraint and that the same was signed by them on the day next after his death. I then read and subscribed before me
