Certificate of the last wishes of William Bailey as to the disposition of the property of which he died possessed made notably by him to the undersigned on the twenty-fifth day of October eighteen hundred and sixty three

I doth upon a true return of papers belonging to me in the possession of William McMore - a part of a deposition made by me with him sometime back - shall it be witness I hold against him for these papers and for others which I have disposed of both sold up to him and that he William McMore attested loyally to the disposition of my property I wish furthermore that all that I have been sojourning and that one half of it be given to the children of William McMore and the other half to the children of Mr. A. M. Bailey my brother of my deceased brother
