

Georgia In the name of God Amen. I William J Ford of  
 Early County; do hereby and do solemnly swear, of a sound mind  
 and disposing memory and conscious that we do make and  
 ordain this my last will and testament. First, as to my just debts to  
 be paid. Second, that my property both real and personal to be  
 kept together until my child or ward at age or marry them to be equal-  
 ly divided between them and my companions. Should either of them die,  
 my children die before arriving at age or without issue then their share to  
 be divided between the survivors. Third, portion of my property falling  
 to my wife Ann A Ford at her death to revert to the benefit of my  
 children named William P Ford Jr, Caldonia A Ford and James  
 Abert Ford and their heirs. Third, Should my executor deem  
 it a disadvantage they are authorized to sell that portion of my real estate  
 known as my mill tract. Fourth, My plantation in the Chattahoochee  
 river I wish kept up and the proceeds of the farms of it, defraying  
 all necessary expenses to accrue to the benefit of my wife & children  
 until a division shall take place to be made.

It is my desire that my child or ward shall be educated liberally and  
 completely and my heirs may choose <sup>such</sup> their profession as to them may  
 seem meet. In the presence of <sup>James P Holmes</sup> an appointed executor and my wife  
 and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
 and seal this <sup>fourth</sup> day of April 1841. Signed, sealed and executed in the presence of  
 John Dill
